Awards will be presented at the EDRA annual meeting, in April in Vancouver, B.C. Winning projects and commentary will be published in the Fall 2005 issue of *Places*. The postmark deadline for submissions is February 7, 2005.

The EDRA/*Places* Awards are unique among the programs that recognize professional and scholarly excellence in environmental design.
