COLOPHON

This journal is set in Caslon, a typeface developed by William Caslon of England, first used in 1722, where he published extensively in the Netherlands. Based upon the 17th century Dutch old-style designs, his popular typeface was used throughout Europe and America. Benjamin Franklin used this typeface exclusively, and Caslon was used to publish the first copies of the Declaration of Independence, as well as the Constitution.

The American Type Founders released their version of Caslon in 1902 and a second, bolder style in 1905. Modern versions include Ed Benguiat's Caslon for the International Typeface Corporation in 1983, and Carol Twombly's Adobe Caslon, for Adobe Corporation.

A transitional typeface, Caslon has a warm and classic style, with high stroke contrast and shorter descenders, that allowed it to hold up with faster presses and the newer papers available after the turn of the previous century. Caslon today, is used extensively in journals, books, and corporate publications.
